Prior experience in teaching Physical Chemistry and success in attracting competitive research funding will be highly regarded. Advanced skills in research training and supervision at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels including the writing of research grant applications and research papers, and other duties associated with a teaching and research academic role are highly desirable.

The position is full-time continuing subject to the satisfactory completion of a confirmation period for new appointees. Membership of a University approved superannuation scheme is a condition of employment for new appointees.
